While not classified formally as a green street project, the City expects to begin construction on the Downtown Streetscape project which will incorporate many of the MRP defined green street elements. This will be an estimated \$5.5 M project to improve aesthetics, promote pedestrian accessibility and traffic calming. The project is comprised of widened sidewalks, decorative paving, corner bulb-outs, seating planters, landscaped medians, flowering trees, reconfigured on-street parking, canopy style street trees with tree lights, furnishings, decorative street lights, child friendly fountain, decorative fence & gateway monument.

Summary: For the most part, bio-retention or LID systems have been functioning adequately. There have been areas where ponding has briefly occurred during peak rain events, though infiltration has caught up during individual rain events to avoid any flooding. As this season included some heavy rain events the implementation of these new C.3 concepts has passed some critical effectiveness tests. We are finding

that many of the older private hydrodynamic separator systems are not being maintained since initial verifications of maintenance contracts. Subsequent to these inspections, we have been receiving inquiries by affected businesses for recommendations of local maintenance firms.

Summary: O&M inspections are performed by City staff from both Wastewater Operations and Engineering. Since the City operates its own wastewater treatment plant, sharing these duties with Engineering staff has helped with the workload. An advantage of operating our own wastewater treatment plant is that the equipment and personnel are immediately available for maintenance when deficiencies are discovered. Overall, the O&M Program is working well.

During the fiscal year the City did not have the volume in building as in years past. Our data base was developed to conform to the reporting format within the previous permit and, as a result, our inspection reporting categories do not necessarily coincide with the current permit reporting categories. However, we have interoperated the data accordingly.

IPM Policy

It is the purpose and intent of this IPM Policy to ensure that the City of Brentwood ("City") departments and all those who apply pesticides to property owned and/or managed by the City utilize integrated pest management (IPM) practices, eliminate or reduce pesticide applications on public-owned and/or City managed property to the maximum extent feasible and as required by State and Regional Stormwater regulation to take all reasonable measures to ensure that pest control activities do not threaten environmental and human health.

The City, in carrying out its pest management operations, shall focus on long term prevention or suppression of pest problems with minimum impact on human health, non-target organisms, and the environment.

The goal of the City is to reduce its use of pesticides and ultimately replace all pesticides with non-toxic methods of controlling pests on City property. The City recognizes that pesticides are potentially hazardous to human health and the environment, and non-pesticide alternatives will be considered over toxic pesticides on City property. The City has developed an IPM program that outlines all the of IPM activities that shall be implemented to ensure that less toxic methods are used to control pests on City property. The City's IPM Program includes the following elements:

1. Establish inspection procedures to monitor pest population levels, perform thorough field assessments of each pest problem, and keep records of such monitoring. Monitoring should be performed by designated personnel or contractors knowledgeable in IPM methods.
2. Establish for each pest an IPM implementation plan which evaluates the biological, aesthetic, and economic loss each site can tolerate and set pest population levels at which corrective action should be taken to ensure that pests do not exceed tolerance levels.
3. Determine corrective actions when an action threshold is reached. Review and consider all available non-chemical options for acceptability and feasibility. Consider the use of chemicals only as a last resort. Select and use chemicals only in accordance with State, Federal and local law and in accordance to the pesticide selection method outlined in the City's IPM program document.
4. Identify and evaluate conditions that encourage pest problems. Modify pest ecosystems to reduce food and living space through physical and cultural practices.

5. Determine most effective treatment time, based on pest biology and other variables identified during the above mentioned inspection and monitoring efforts during the field assessments of each pest problem.
6. Establish and maintain an accurate electronic data base to catalog monitoring information and to document and evaluate the effectiveness of pest management procedures.
7. Evaluate the effectiveness of the IPM program and make adjustments as needed.
8. Conduct an ongoing education program for City staff, contract maintenance personnel and members of the public.
9. Designate an IPM Coordinator and Committee to oversee that the IPM program is implemented correctly and appropriately to uphold this document's goals and objectives for IPM practices.
10. Hire pesticide applicators that incorporate IPM implementation in their services and bind them to all City IPM polices outlined in the City IPM program document.

When are pest control chemicals needed?

The first step is to carefully scout to determine if spraying really is necessary. Weather conditions, previous pest problems, and soil type and fertility are factors that may be used when deciding if treatments are needed. Pesticides should only be used as a last resort when less risky methods, such as mating disruption, trapping or weeding, don't work.

If you spot a pest, that doesn't mean you should immediately start spraying. You need to determine if there are a sufficient number of pests causing enough economic damage to justify the use of the pesticide. This is called the "action threshold." In an IPM program, you should only apply chemicals when pests reach or exceed the action threshold.

Before starting treatments, know the pest you are dealing with. Make sure the pest is not a beneficial insect that may actually help solve your problem by preying on the pests that are killing your plants.

Choosing and using the right pest control chemical

Once you identify the pest, purchase the proper chemical that can keep the situation under control. Try to use one that is effective, economical, and low in toxicity. Avoid highly toxic chemicals that can harm people, pets, wildlife, beneficial insects, or the environment. Purchase only enough pesticide to do the job and mix only enough to complete the assigned task. If necessary, seek professional advice from your county Extension agent.

Oftentimes, "spot spraying" will work at controlling your pest problems. This means applying the chemical only in the areas where there is the greatest concentration of pests as opposed to spraying all areas where pests may or may not exist. Spraying the entire field or all of your plants is often wasteful and environmentally damaging.

Always read the label directions before buying and applying pesticides, and never use more of the chemical than necessary. Over-application may not only affect human health and the environment; it is also illegal.

Do not apply pesticides on very windy days. Otherwise, the chemical may drift onto neighboring properties.

Don't rely on the same chemical for a long period of time. Insects, weeds, and plant pathogens may develop a resistance to the pesticide, reducing the chemical's ability to control pest problems. To delay the development of resistance, it is best to alternate between chemicals with different modes of action. Be sure to keep a written log of

pesticides that are used and when they are applied, so you can use it as a reference every growing season.

Pesticide safety tips

Pesticide application generally requires the use of personal protective equipment (PPE), such as coveralls, gloves, eyewear and/or respiratory protection, which reduces the chances for exposure to the chemical. Always read the pesticide label to determine the minimum amount of PPE that is necessary. Chemicals that are accidentally splashed on the skin could result in burns, dermatitis, or other skin conditions, while inhalation may result in permanent damage to the lungs or central nervous system.

When chemical applications are completed, remove all PPE. If it can be reused, be sure to clean it separately from your work clothing or family clothing. Never re-wear pesticide-contaminated clothing. Thoroughly shower and wash your hair as soon as possible.

Store pesticides in cool, dry areas, and protect them from moisture and temperature extremes. Always keep chemicals in their original, labeled containers. Never store them in soda bottles or food containers.

Do's & don'ts of using a chemical in an IPM program

Do	Don't
Use chemicals only as a last resort.	Don't automatically use pesticides on all of your plants or your entire field. Carefully scout first, and "spot spray" in areas where pest activity is the greatest.
Identify the pest you are dealing with before purchasing and using chemicals.	Don't rely on the same chemical for a long period of time. Instead, alternate chemicals with different modes of action.
Use personal protective equipment when applying pesticides.	Don't over-apply pesticides. Always follow label directions.
